SUBSEQUENT MEETINGS

In preparation for subsequent meetings and keeping the project moving forward, the following are potential themes, topics and ideas for the next two meetings (far from etched in stone though). Give these some thought.

Meeting #2:

- Hear from Informational Resources (potential sources)
 - Sunriver Police Department (Bike Patrol Statistics)
 - Sunriver Bike Rental Shop Representatives
 - Bend Park District Representatives
 - Other Planned Communities with Pathways (i.e. Caldera)
- The goal is to get statistical data from these sources as may be appropriate to address concerns/potential solutions for Sunriver.
- Hear their methods for addressing some of the same issues that are experienced in Sunriver.
- Changes to State Law regarding e-bikes, etc., that affect use on Sunriver pathways and roads.
- Homework - Break the Task Force into sub-groups to conduct research on specific topics and discuss various issues related to such and then report back to the Task Force at a subsequent meeting.

Meeting #3:

- Review homework assignments and research conducted by sub-groups – one person from each sub-group to report findings.
- Decide which facts/data and case studies are relevant to Sunriver pathways.
- Discuss concerns and possible solutions thereto as identified in meeting #1 and apply the new information learned (meaning the facts/data and case studies from other resources) to Sunriver.
- Develop criteria for prioritizing concerns that are applicable to Sunriver – what are the highest priorities and what is the basis for such determination.
- Begin to discuss solutions to the prioritized concerns and evaluate the practicality of such.
